**Minutes**

**1) Welcome**

Monica Vaughan welcomed everyone to the meeting and welcomed Janice Treasure as the new Disciplinary Secretary.

**3) Minutes**

Kelly Whittaker proposed the minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on 16<sup>th</sup> June 2012 be accepted as a true record. Sarah Feast seconded the proposal and the motion was carried forward.

**5) Annual Report**

Monica Vaughan gave the chairman's report and stated the changes to the constitution. The disciplinary training that England Netball is launching in July and September was discussed. Anyone interested in the training was asked to let Amy Hewick know.

New TSG members required; Monica explained the benefits of becoming a member of a TSG and the opportunities to get involved with specific areas, for example officiating.

**Key objectives for the coming year:**

Closer relationship with counties to develop a competition structure that will provide the appropriate level of competition for all clubs from grassroots to Region and ensure that entry league dates fit with the competition structure to enable teams to compete at the right level. Coach Development and the setting up of a coaches association.

Monica asked the Chairs of the TSGs if there was anything to add to their reports and a summary was given by each TSG Chair.

### Competition - Carol Alexander

Year of change for competition group

Small group of members of TSG who worked really hard with U14s to Open leagues and organised various tournaments.

Appealing for more people to help out, would like to have one person per event. Without the help they will struggle to progress ideas further

Plans to make changes with South Open League

3 divisions – want to set high standard

Any changes will be a gradual progress and teams will be notified.

### Officiating - Carol Williams

First conference in April which saw 70 umpires and it was a great success. Sally Gray commented and stated it was an excellent course and gave positive feedback.

Carol thanked everyone involved and had no questions asked.

### Performance – Phyllis Avery

Phyllis spoke about the Academy Festival when counties put forward their best players. At the festival they are looked at and invited to the PDP screening.

Team South are placed 8<sup>th</sup> in the league but were very close on several occasions, losing by 1 or 2 goals.

Phyllis thanked the parents and the athletes for their weekly commitments to training.

For the U17 athletes, Netball South had introduced training this year in preparation for when EN introduces the Foundation League.

Phyllis thanked Elly Moore for all her hard work this season.

Elly gave a presentation on performance and used England Netball's vision and market research to identify the changes to the pathway.

Excel (U17 & U19) has changed to 'Performance' and Excel + (U21 & Senior) has changed to 'High Performance Programme'.

The vision and dreams stay the same, but the opportunities have risen due to the investment given by Sport England with £5mill given to high end and £3.5mill given to satellite (U17s & U19s).

Elly's new title is 'Regional Performance Coach'.

The pathway allows for less sideways movement and encourages athletes to move throughout the pathway.

In 2017, England Netball aspires to the following:

- Training environments are year round – 48 weeks a year
- 108 satellite academies instead of 54
- 63 county academies

Janice Treasure asked what the incentive will be.

Monica Vaughan stated it was to play for England.

Discussion was held with regards to attending school and taking GCSEs/A levels and the increase in training.

Discussion was also held with regards to the increase in training leading to an increase in injury.
