Welcome to 2014 Netball South – AGM

A big thank you to the Members of the Regional Board, Technical Support Groups (TSGs), Regional Manager, Regional Co-ordinator and the personnel within our Counties for the time and devotion that they have given to developing Netball in our Region.

The Region has a number of TSGs and these are chaired by members of the Regional Management Board. Each TSG provides a report, however unfortunately the coaching TSG has not had a lead and we have been unable to move anything forward in this area. We do have people willing to sit on the Coaching TSG but need someone from the RMB to chair and lead the group.

We are always looking for people to get involved in the TSGs and it is an ideal way to get involved in a specific area of interest in officiating, competition, performance and events.

The Competition Group held a meeting with counties and teams in December which was well received and we hope to run more meetings /conferences to find out what you, our members, want and how we can progress.

The Performance group has had real challenges this year as the focus on a 'Netball first' attitude for performance athletes has been paramount. The changes required to monitor each County's performance plans as well as the Region's has created more work. The benefits of this are that Counties and Regions are working closer together. The changes have meant that some of our athletes have been able to access performance centres outside of our region to limit their travelling.

Bill has been looking at our website and we are currently reviewing and pulling together a specification for a new site.

This will be my last year as Chair. Living in the North East I feel as though I'm becoming more remote and not able to give the time that is required to chair the Region effectively and contribute to the development of players and coaches. I would like to wish the Region all the best for the future and to thank the Counties and Clubs for their contribution and support to the South Region in attending meetings/conferences, officiating and playing in competitions.

Competition – Carol Alexander

After a successful County Engagement Day last August, the CTSG followed this up with a Competition meeting in December. Representatives from all Regional League Clubs and County Committees were invited and over 40 people attended. The aim was to get more people involved but also to listen to the views/suggestions from around the region.

A League Entry Tournament will still be the way of deciding the top 8 teams to form the Regional League at U13/14/16/19 age groups. At the meeting, Counties offered to run a 2nd tier competition for teams not successful at gaining a place in the League and the CTSG will work with Counties to co-ordinate this once numbers are known.

In 2013/14 we ran an U12 league for first time. Unfortunately we only had interest from 3 clubs but they managed to play some very successful triangular fixtures. For the 2014/15 season, we will be running an U13 league in place of the U12 league but will allow players over 11 years old to participate.

All of the relevant entry forms have been circulated for Play Offs, End of Season Tournament, Entry Tournament and League Entries but to date no information is finalised as closing dates have not passed.

The End of Season Tournament will to be held at Wavell on 7th June and will have teams playing at U13, U15 and Open age groups. A Masters age group was offered again this year but had to be cancelled due to lack of entries.

Provisional dates for next season have been circulated with all Open teams, including possible new entrants, being made aware they may have to travel to Guernsey.

There were no real problems in 2013/14 and all leagues ran smoothly and the weather being kind to us. Congratulations to Just Ahead that won Division 1 and we wish them success at the Premier League Play Offs together with Sussex Thunder who are contesting to stay in Premier Division 3. The format for SR Play Offs has changed this year in an attempt to ensure we have the best teams in each division. However exact details cannot be agreed until results are known from Premier Play Offs.

The 2014/15 Rules and Regulations will be reviewed and agreed by the Board once we have information from England Netball.

Finally, I would like to thank the CTSG members for their hard work in administering the leagues and tournaments. A particular success was the Regional National Schools Competition held in Southampton.

With more help the CTSG could offer more to clubs and ease the workload for a few. If anyone is interested in helping please contact the regional office.

The Competition pages on the website have been tidied up hopefully making it easier to find information but this task is being reviewed.

Officiating – Carol Williams

This has been a much more successful year for the OTSG following a period of uncertainty and direction. The OTSG have managed to work more proactively and are continuing to develop the support we are able to give in all areas of officiating. However, the group is still in need of new members to support the work we are planning for the coming season.

The season has been an extremely busy one for umpires at all levels whether officiating in the local leagues or at Regional and National levels and we are very pleased to see the continued success of our umpires in the South.

Following on from the first Officiating conference in April 2013, which was attended by 70 umpires across the region from all levels, this year we have held an Umpires' Conference specifically for those umpires on the Approved Umpires List (AUL). The aim of the conference was to get further understanding from the umpires as to how the OTSG can support them as well as clarify the expectation from the OTSG of being on the AUL. In addition we concentrated on "Dealing with Discipline" and the Rules particularly in this area including a focus on the advancement of penalties.

National Appointments

Premier League Play Off

Many of our A Award umpires attended the playoffs at the beginning of May which saw one of our regional teams Clan progress into Premier League 2, whilst our remaining teams, Blades and Sussex have remained in the league. We wish them success for the coming season.

National Schools Finals 2014

Despite being held in Cheshire team South fielded the highest number of umpires including Emma Dell, Chantel Moore, Nikki Dewick, Nigel Gill, and Alice Johnson. Two of our mentors also attended, Yvonne Jamison and Audrey Castle.

National Under 14 and 16 Finals

This year U14 competition is being held in Sheffield and all NTL umpires were asked to attend. 3 South Umpires were able to take up this offer being Estelle Ball, Elaine Holmes and Chris Obin. The U16 finals are being held in Redbridge and we are being represented by Elaine Holmes and Estelle Ball.

EN Premier League

As well as many of our A Award umpires, some of our B Award umpires were appointed to some Premier League 3rd Div games.

Netball Conference

This was held in September at Nottingham University and was attended by a number of South umpires. Some financial support was provided. The Conference was opened to all umpires of all levels for the first time and this is the same theme being carried forward for this years conference "Make the Game". All umpires will have been surveyed to see what themes they would like covered in this event.

OTSG has organised two B Award courses this year:

C Awards

This year saw the continuation across the region of a high number of assessments for beginner and C Awards umpires. During the coming year the region will be working with the county umpiring secretaries to increase our number of learner umpires and those acquiring their umpire awards.

Assessors

Following on from last year re accreditation of Assessors we are still unable to get any new assessors with the course still being devised through England Netball.

Open League 1st Division

60 A and B Award umpires have been eligible to officiate during the season for Division 1 but with commitments to Premier League it is a difficult balance to ensure that we have enough umpires for every match. Many thanks to

Jenny Poore and Kim Schepens who organised the umpire schedule and dealt with continuing changes right up to the last minute. Not an easy task but helped enormously by the work of Gillian Frackleton.

Once again umpires were very efficient and travelled together when possible. Many thanks to them for their professionalism and commitment. For the coming year we will be allocating umpires to Div 1 and Div 2 – so watch this space.

NPL League

We have had a very successful year with a number of our NPL umpires being successful with their A awards and some of this success has been as a result of videoing umpires to develop their skills and direct feedback.

Estelle Ball and Chris Obin being in their second year were utilised in the opening weekend of the NPL season and they both successfully completed their A assessment in March this year. Nikki Dewick also was successful along with Emma Dell who this year was not used for NPL as had had this exposure for the last three years. I am also pleased to say that she too has passed her A award assessment.

With regards to match bench officiating we held a theory evening led by Carol Alexander and with 22 participants it resulted in the home fixtures being well supported. In addition to the home fixtures being well supported I was also well supported for match bench officiating for the closing weekend resulting in Carol Alexander and Nicola Lindsay attending.

It has been commented at NPL weekends that Team South work well as a team with regards to the match bench supporting the umpires and the umpires supporting one another very well.

Performance and NPL – Phyllis Avery MBE

‘Performance’ covers both Team South and the Regional Performance Programme.

Team South

Trials were held on 5th and 12th September 2013 at Loddon Valley Leisure Centre and a training squad selected. As was expected, some members of last year’s Team South attended trials for Surrey Storm (which has a Superleague franchise), and were successful, but others remained loyal to Team South. Training was held weekly, with Elly Moore, Head Coach, Lisa Manning as Assistant Coach, and Sue Baldwin, Team Manager. The first fixture was the tournament in November at the Worcester Arena, followed by the Netball Performance League Opening Weekend in December at Loughborough University. There were only two home matches, one against Team Bath Youth, and the other against Surrey Storm (which had to be played at Surrey Sports Park due to difficulties over suitable court availability in the South).

The final weekend was held on 5th and 6th April in Loughborough. On the Saturday, Netball South beat Loughborough Lightning 42-37, and lost narrowly to West Midlands Warriors by 40-41, resulting in a final position of seventh. Elsa Wakeman, England U19, (Blades) who was part of the Netball South squad was, unfortunately, injured (ACL) at the tournament in November, and was unable to play in any of the league matches.

In the Challenge Competition held on Sunday, 6th April 2014, Netball South beat Lightning and Surrey Storm (twice!) which meant Netball South were in the Cup (top 4) and Storm went into the Plate. In the semi-final Netball South beat Yorkshire Jets 14-13, and then played Manchester Thunder – unbeaten the whole season – in the final, and lost 9-14, but came home the very proud possessors of the Cup runners-up medals.

Netball South would like to thank all the parents who ferried their daughters around so willingly and patiently, and also helped organise a raffle at the ‘home’ matches to raise funds to support Team South.

Regional Academies

This is part of a four-year programme, funded by England Netball. The South **Regional Performance Academy** has been running since July 2013 at Oasis Community Hub, Maybush, on Monday evenings from 8.00 to 10.00 pm, preceded by 1½ hours Strength & Conditioning at Solent University, and attended by seventeen athletes. Additional

sessions have been run on Thursday evenings at Loddon Valley Leisure Centre for one hour, prior to NPL training, and on Tuesday and Thursday early mornings at Oasis. Head Coach is Elly Moore, Performance Pathway Coach, who is employed by England Netball. Assistant Coaches, who are volunteers, are Vanessa Clothier and Sue Baldwin at Oasis on a Monday evening, and Liz Creighton at Loddon Valley L.C. on Thursday evenings. The region has been required to deliver 6 hours coach contact time each week, rising to 8 hours from the start of the coming summer holiday period.

The location of the academy has been difficult for some athletes, and a few have dropped out due to pressure of school work/travel, and others have been steered to nearer RPAs in the East and London & S. East regions.

The **Regional Academy** has also been held from September 2013 at Oasis Community Hub for 2 hours each week on Monday evenings from 6.00 – 8.00 pm, and attended by approximately 20 athletes. From the start of the coming summer holiday period delivery will be increased to 4 hours each week for year 2 of the programme.

England Netball is holding a Netball Performance Foundation League Pilot Event at Redbridge Sports and Leisure Centre on 5th and 6th July, and each region has been invited to enter one team per Regional Academy. Players must be under 17 (born 1997 or later) and the South will be entering a team.

National Academy

As a result of screening in March, the following South athletes have been selected into the National Academy programme:-

Ashleigh Dekker, Alana John, Charlotte Maxfield, Tash Pavelin, Elsa Wakeman, and Fran Williams.

In addition, Chartie Curtis and Lucy Dicks-Ilori have been selected into the National Academy Potential Group.

Fran Williams was also selected for the Netball Europe U17 competition – and played in all quarters of every match - and has also been selected as part of a National Academy squad of 12 to tour Botswana in August to play against African teams, Namibia, Botswana, and local league sides.

Academies Festival

This was very successful and was held at The Dome, University of Chichester, for representative County (U16) and Satellite (U14) squads on 26th April. 24 Academy squads took part (220 performance athletes) in a 5 hours plus non-stop festival. Awards were made linked to England Netball's performance trademarks (i.e. United, Relentless, Diverse, Resilient, Fearless) and athletes nominated by their County Academy Coach received feedback on their progress. Some were graduated to the Netball South Regional Academy or, at their request, recommended to trial for another region nearer to where they live or go to school.

County Performance Planning

As part of the 'Performance' four-year programme, counties were able to access funding support from England Netball to run their Performance programme for the two years 2014-2016. Counties had to submit their plan to the region for assessment before it was forwarded to England Netball, so a meeting was set up for County Chairs and County Performance Leads to help and support them complete their plans and applications.

Feedback was provided to all counties, with suggested revisions to ensure that they met the Terms and Conditions of the award, and subsequently all counties, with the exception of the Isle of Wight, were advised that they will receive funding support from England Netball towards the costs of running their Satellite and County Academies for the next two years. (The region will contribute an amount to IOW to help and support them maintain a development programme on the island.)

At the request of the counties, the region will be running a workshop for Academy Coaches on 12th July to address and clarify any uncertainties with regard to delivering the Performance programme. The coach will be Elly Moore, the region's Performance Pathway Coach.

The Future

A residential Summer Camp will be held at Bradfield College from August 11 – 15 for RPA, RA and CA athletes, approx. ages 15 – 18. The sessions are all 'open' for the region's coaches to participate in or to watch.

England Netball would like to work towards all regions and counties agreeing to specific days for levels of competition/training as follows, as many young athletes face competing demands on their time:-

2013/14 has been another busy and progressive year for netball in the South and across the country. England Netball was recently named at the BT Sport Industry awards as Governing Body of the Year 2014. This is an outstanding award and a real recognition of the journey we have all been on. We have started to implement new initiatives and products that fit with what players want, to try and attract and sustain more people playing netball. Below provides a summary of activity run against each initiative.



Back to Netball is still having a huge impact on netball across the South with an additional 32 programmes being run this year engaging over 620 new participants back into netball through the work of the Netball Development Officers (NDOs). The Netball Development Community coaches (NDCCs) who focus on Back to Netball delivery have also engaged an additional 1064 participants over the last 12 months. We have been working hard with identified Back to Netball groups to transition them into teams/clubs so they can enter local leagues to allow them to continue playing and also open up capacity for new Back to Netballers to join the running sessions.



The Netball Development Officers have also been working with schools and clubs not only to establish School Club Links but also supporting the county level school games which runs in each county. These games see High 5 netball along with junior netball being played with young volunteers helping to run the days. We have also recently introduced a new High 5 workshop which is available for teachers and coaches which aims to provide more information and support with their delivery of High 5 in schools and clubs. The Region has seen 4 of these courses delivered over the past 6 months and we hope to deliver more in the next year.



Our club accreditation scheme CAPS continues to work alongside Sport England’s Clubmark accreditation and we now have many of the junior clubs within the region accredited. During the last 12 months the following clubs have achieved CAPS accreditation and re-accreditation, congratulations to them all.....

Netball Now is a new initiative which we piloted over the summer. It is a simple, straight forward way to play netball. It's not a coached session, it's not a competition led by rules, regulations or scores recorded it is simply a session that you turn up at, pay a small fee and play a game of netball!

We ran one Netball Now in each county over the summer which saw 164 participants take part. We will continue to run these over the summer and we're currently working on a phased roll out to work with partners and the netball community to deliver more sessions in each county over the next 12 months.



The regional unit has again organised a number of UKCC courses (4x Level 1, 3x Level 2 and 2x Level 2 upgrade). This has had a positive impact on the numbers of qualified coaches delivering within the region providing over an additional 250 new Level 1 coaches and over 120 new Level 2 coaches. The Region will continue to develop the course planning process so that the numbers of qualified coaches continues to grow to support the demand for coaches to deliver programmes.

In addition to the coach qualifications, the NDO's have organised a selection of the series of six coach workshops (On the Ball, On the Move, Sharp Shooting, Activate, Getting Physical & Winning the Ball) based on demand across the region.



There has been a significant increase in young volunteers taking up the volunteer programmes available with the Region now boasting over 371 Pass on your Passion volunteers. This initiative encourages young volunteers to continue their involvement as a netball volunteer by rewarding them for their time and hopefully keep them involved in volunteering and netball for life. Over March the Region also supported the Net 10 for Life initiative which was to support Cancer Research.

Berkshire Netball has also been busy this year in a number of ways:-

- Supported Level 1 and Level 2 Coaches to gain their qualifications.
- Supported Umpires to achieve their awards
- Organised a Berkshire Netball Awards evening attended by over 500 people to celebrate the successes and achievements of people within Berkshire
- Run Under 16 and Under 14 Academies for almost 60 talented young players
- Organised and run the County round of the National Schools competition with two teams from Berkshire going on to represent the Region at National Finals
- Team South have used facilities in Berkshire for training and matches
- Tri-County Play Days have taken place within Berkshire
- Provided bursaries to support talented athletes
- Academy coaches have attended National Coaching Conference in September 2013
- Berkshire athletes have progressed up the Performance Pathway to Regional and National level
- Berkshire Clubs have been represented in all the Regional Leagues – Open, U19, U16 and U14 – with Woodley U14s going to National Finals to represent the Region
- Welcomed new members to the Berkshire Netball Management Board
- Two new CAPS clubs have been created

Hampshire

Over the last 12 months Hampshire Netball Association has continued to work for the good of netball. One of the first tasks was to finalise the new 4 year plan, which has now been completed and will continue to be used as a working document.

The All Hampshire Junior Netball League is going from strength to strength. In its second season 32 teams took part covering under 12s, under 13s, under 14s and under 16s. The League also held two very successful tournaments including a Versatility tournament to close the season. This season saw more than 400 junior players registered and a range of clubs have won honours in the league and tournaments, which shows a healthy development of players across the county. In addition to playing, an excellent support system has been put in place to use the League for up and coming umpires to provide them opportunities to gain experience and mentoring. The volunteer workforce to support the organisation of the League has increased 3-fold, which has been a great development of the league. There has been also been a tremendous network of support across clubs to make match rearrangements when rain has stopped play. Although the weather has been very kind to Hampshire Juniors this season! As one of the largest

counties in England, the constant challenge is to provide playing opportunities within a county that can take 90 minutes to cross, if not longer! All this was only achievable with the dedication and commitment of committee member Sarah Wakeman and her new sub group committee.

Hampshire also continued to support the schools with tournaments for under 12s, under 14s, under 16s and under 19s incorporating the county round of the National Schools competition whereby the top 2 schools in each age group went onto the regional round where Portsmouth Grammar School under 16s earned places in the National Final, finishing 5th. The High 5 competition will again take place at the School Games event later this month.

The Academy programme for under 14s and under 16s was increased this year in line with recommendations from England Netball. Not only was the number of weeks increased but the addition of matches against other Academies was included. 28 players were selected for the under 14 and 21 for the under 16s. The 2014/15 Academy is currently being finalised to fit with England Netball plans including changing the selection process.

This year Hampshire started a County Open league as the only route to Regional Play Off. There were 8 teams this season, with around 90 players. Team Force were the overall winners with Winchester Netball Club as runner ups. As Team Force do not have enough players to enter regional play offs, Winchester will enter. FM Eclipse were relegated to local league. It is planned for next season to have 2 divisions of 8 providing enough teams want to enter. Special thanks to Chris Granger for all her hard work and commitment in setting up and running the league.

Hampshire have again run umpiring courses at a Beginner and C Award Level with two Beginner courses and three C Award courses run this season.

The number of clubs affiliated in Hampshire is 197 with 3202 affiliated adults and 1477 juniors. The number of primary schools has increased to 77 as has the number of secondary schools to 69.
